CIRCULAR

Subject: Regarding prescription of medicine by Generic name

With reference to Indian Medical Council (Professional Conduct, Etiquette & Ethics) Regulations, 2002 (amended in 2016) and MCI Letter No. MCI-211(2)(Gen)/2017-Ethics/104728 dated 21/04/2017, directing all Registered Medical Practitioners under the IMC Act to comply with Clause 1.5, which reads as under:-

"Every physician should prescribe drugs with generic name legibly and preferably in capital letters and he/she shall ensure that there is rational prescription and use of drugs"

However, it has been observed that despite repeated directions, many Physicians/Doctors of the private hospitals, empanelled under DGEHS, are not prescribing medicine by Generic name.

Therefore, in view of above, it is, once again, reiterated that Medical Director/Medical Superintendent of DGEHS empanelled private hospitals should ensure that every Physician/Doctor under their supervision should prescribe drugs with Generic name legibly and, preferably, in Capital letters and ensure that there is a rational prescription and use of drugs in line with MCI Regulations.
