Chapter 5 SCHOOL HEALTH SCHEME

The Directorate of Health Services started School Health Scheme in March 1979 with six school health clinics initially. The scheme later expanded to provide comprehensive health care services to the school going children. The School Health Clinics were established in the school premises itself for easy accessibility by children. These were planned to cover the children studying in Government and Government Aided Secondary schools.

The facilities under the scheme are provided through a network of School Health Clinics and School Referral Centres. The revamped scheme Chacha Nehru Sehat Yojna was announced by Hon'ble Chief Minister of Delhi, in her budget speech on 22nd March 2011 and launched on 14th November, 2011.

Objectives of School Health Scheme

- Ascertaining health status of children studying in Govt. schools till XII class
- Screening for deficiencies, diseases and disabilities.
- > Counseling & treating wherever deficiencies and diseases are detected.
- ➤ Referral wherever required to district FRU/tertiary hospitals.
- > Increasing health awareness and inculcating healthy behaviour.
- Facilitating continuum of health care by creating data base.
- > Synergizing with relevant programmes of Education Deptt.(Yuva) & Health Deptt. (Blindness Control, Deafness Control & AIDS Programme etc.)

Total 11 new SHC's were added during current financial year under CNSY.

District referral health mela organized in central district on 1st December 2012. The event was launched by Hon'ble cabinet minister for IT & Communication, Hon'ble minister, health & Family Welfare and Hon'ble minister Education. 3000 children attended the event. The secondary level services were provided at the event included stalls for first aid, eye/vision testing and distribution of spectacles, ENT services, health/ nutrition, communication & counseling. Magic shows were conducted on various awareness topics.

Weekly Iron Folic Acid Supplementaion Programme has been started since July 2013 covering all school children of Delhi to take care of the problem of Iron Deficinecy /Anemia. This programme was launched by the Hon'ble Chief Minister on 15thJuly, 2013 for weekly administration of Iron & Folate Supplementation (WIFS) to all students from class 6th to 12th of Delhi Govt. and Delhi Govt. Aided, NDMC, Cantonment Board. Target population- 16, 00,000 students in 1209 schools of 6-12th class. Out of school girls being covered through Dept. of WCD-50000.

Deworming programme was launched in July 2012 with arrangements for appropriate Emergency response system in place and arrangement for reporting of adverse events.

All school children were adminsitred the medicin e in schools of Delhi. Deworming programme in Delhi Govt. Schools / out of schools children with Deptt. Of WCD administered 34 Lakhs in one single day on 21st Feb 2013 (a record). II -phase of Mass deworming programme launched on 24th Sep. 2013 for the age group 2yrs to 18 years and implemented on 3rd October 2013 followed by mop up day on 5th October 2013. Teachers trained in providing first aid in case of adverse events in schools.
