Minutes of Meeting

Dated: 13/09/18

A meeting of the Advisory Committee for Biomedical Waste Management was held on 16.08.2018 at 05.00 PM under the Chairmanship of Secretary, Health & Family Welfare Department in his conference hall, Delhi Secretariat, New Delhi-110002, to discuss the issue regarding Biomedical Waste Management and streamlining the system in delhi. List of participants is annexed.

After a round of introduction by the members and invitees, the meeting commenced with welcome address by the Chairperson. The following issues were deliberated and decisions taken in the meeting.
